DEATH NOTICES FROM THE HAMILTON SPECTATOR

(Transcribed by Dorothy May Bond dec.)

From 1/1/1876 to 31/12/1880.

(Part 2)

HAGGESTTON Frederick Haggestton, a bootmaker aged 23, third son of Joseph Haggestton of Portland, died 18/9/1879.

HARRIS A little daughter of Mr Harris, the C of E Minister at Heywood, was buried there on 29/3/1878.

HAYWARD At Heywood on 5/12/1880, Henry Woodland Hayward, aged 60 yrs.

HEANEY A child aged 11, of James Heaney, died at Merino on 25/4/1880

HENDERSON George Ralph Henderson, aged 2 years and a month, son of James Francis Henderson, the myamyn schoolteacher, drowned about 9/11/1880 and was buried 12/9/1880. There are other children.

HENTY On 10/2/1877, at Merino Downs, of conjestion of the lungs and epilepsy, Lawrence Shum, only son of Francis and Mary Ann Henty, in his 32nd year, he was not married and was buried at Merino on 12/2/1877.

HERBERTSON Robert Herbertson, aged 70, a resident of Portland for nearly 30 years, died about 23/1/1879 (25/1/1879)

HESELDINE Samuel Heseldine of the South Riding of the Portland Shire, died some time ago. (26/7/1876)

HICKS A child of Robert Hicks died at Merino on 30/4/1880.

HILL George Hill, an old resident of Merino, died 17/3/1980.

HOLLIS W Hollis, an old resident of Portland, died at the residence of A Pitcher, his son-in-law, at Coleraine. He was buried at Portland on 20/6/1890.

HOLLOWAY Peter Holloway, unmarried, about 30, died near Portland on 6/8/1877.

HUF Johann Huf, aged 58, a laborer at Tahara, was found dead at Merino Downs on 9/12/1880. he was born at Hesse Darmstadt, Germany.

HUGHES Edward Francis Hughes, a journalist aged 63, died at Portland on 21/8/1979. He came to Adelaide in 1853. Some of his family live at Hay, New South Wales.

JARRETT Stephen Jarrett, an ironmonger, died at Portland on 4/1/1879, aged 78. He was a Wesleyan and the father of Harriet Campbell and Stephen Jarrett.

JELBERT Mrs Jelbert, of Chetwynd, who has been married for only one year, died on 17/8/1876 and was married at Merino.

JONES A girl aged 6, daughter of Mr & Mrs Jones of Portland, died recently. (26/6/1879).

KENNEDY On 11/4/1876, of scarlet fever, at Merino Police Station, Herbert Edward, aged 8 years, the child of Thomas Trant and Lucy Anna Kennedy. His father is a Police Constable.

KENNEDY On 5/4/1876, of scarlet fever, at Merino Police Station, Gerald John, child of Thomas Trant and Lucy Anna Kennedy, aged 6.5 years. Buried 6/4/1876.

KENNEDY At Merino Police Station on 12/4/1876, of scarlet fever, Caroline Mary Ellen, aged 3.5 years, the child of Thomas Trant and Lucy Anna Kennedy.

KENNEDY At Merino on 23/4/1876, of scarlet fever, Annie Lucy, aged 9.5 years, the child of Thomas Trant and Lucy Anna Kennedy.

LAMBERT Mrs Jane Lambert, a widow with no family, died at Greenvale on 16/6/1980 and was buried at Heywood on 18/6/1880.

LEARMONTH On 10/8/1880, at Ettrick, Robert, second son of William Learmonth, aged 40 years.

LOWE Albert Edward Lowe, son of James Lowe, formerly of Sandford, died 7/9/1880 at Lyons, Lower Crawford.

LYNE On 28/1/1878 at Portland, Eliza Anne Lyne, the beloved wife of Frederick Lewis Lyne, Solicitor. Portland.

McCARTHY On 23/4/1880 at Condah, Letitia Amanda. the beloved wife of Mr Richard McCarthy of Condah, aged 45 years. She was buried at Portland on 25/4/1880.

McDONALD On 26/7/1876 at Elgin, Condah. William McDonald,, aged 17 years after a long illness. The beloved son of A and C McDonald.

McDONALD Two children. of Mr A McDonald of Dartmoor. have died of diptheria 30/11/1879.

McEACHERN Andrew, aged 20 years, son of Duncan McEachern, died in Melbourne on 21/11/1879 and is to be buried at South Portland Cemetery on 23/11/1879.

McKENZIE On 5/10/1877 at Darlots Creek, Condah, Charles McKenzie, the dearly beloved grandson of Mr Hector McKinnon, formerly of Coll, Scotland, aged 8 years and 5 months.

McLENNAN On 21/1/1878 at the Dairy, Dartmoor, of Phthisis, Kenneth McLennan, third son of John and Rebecca McLennan aged 20 years. Inverness papers please copy (12/11/1878)

McLENNAN On 23/1/1879 at the Dairy, Dartmoor, Elizabeth McLennan, only daughter of John and Rebecca McLennan aged 26 years. Inverness papers please copy (181211879)

McPHERSON A son of Mrs McPherson of Dartmoor, died of diptheria on 18/4/1878.

MADDOCK Mrs Maddock of Gawler Street, Portland, died 1/7/1879.

MALLETT A child of Mrs Mallett died at Merino recently (25/3/1876)

MALONEY A child of Mrs Maloney died recently at Merino (25/3/1876)

MALSEED A son of Stewart Malseed of Portland, aged about 16 or 17 years drowned at Narrawong on 30/1/1876.

MANNING On 6/11/1878, at his residence in Hurd Street, Portland, Edward Manning, aged 55 years. He was Clerk of Petty Sessions and had a young son.

MATTHEWS A son of Mr John Matthews of Heywood, died of diptheria (18/9/1879)

MAYFIELD Mrs Margaret Mayfield aged 49 years, of Portland, was buried On 11/2/1878. Her husband and children live at Ballarat.

MORRISON Donald Morrison aged 65 years, ships carpenter, died at Portland on 3/10/1878 and is to be buried in the new cemetery on 4/10/1878.

MURDOCH James Murdoch, shoemaker, died at Merino about 25/2/1877. He was about 65 years and came from Edinburgh, Scotland. A son and a daughter live in Melbourne and a brother lives in New South Wales (3/3/1877)

NORTHCOTT On 20/12/1878 at the Commercial Hotel, Merino, Jane the second and dearly beloved daughter of George and Jane Northcott, aged 13 years.

O'DONNOUGH A child aged 6 years, of Mrs Oldonnough of Digby, died of Scarlet fever on 23/8/1876.

PEACOCK Edward Peacock, of the West Riding of Portland Shire, died some time ago (26/7/1876)

PERRY A daughter aged 1 year and 9 months, of F Perry, died 13/9/1878 at Pleasant Hills, Merino.

POTTAGE Ebenezer Pottage, of the West Riding of Portland Shire, died some time ago (26/7/1876)

PRATT Thomas Pratt aged 14 years, son of William Pratt, a Kinkella (near Dartmoor) farmer, died 17/9/1876.

MARIE'S MEMORABILIA

This month Marie presents Part 6 of her series of items on schools in Warrnambool and the surrounding district.

Page numbers quoted after the school number are the page on which the history of the school is covered in book 2 of 'Vision and Realisation'.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS IN THE VICINITY OF WARRNAMBOOL INCLUDING THE TERANG,
MORTLAKE, CARAMUT, KOROIT AND PORT FAIRY AREAS.
PART 5

ELLERSLIE School Number 1127 see page 906

This school only existed briefly. Head Teacher was James M Edwards when it opened 1/5/1871 as a new quasi-vested* Common School planned to be operational until 1118 Ballangeich opened. It, closed 31/10/1872 as a Common School.

* Quasi-vested. Quasi means that is to say, as if it were.

NIRRANDA School Number 1130 see page 906

A school opened 1/6/1870 in temporary premises lent by William O'Brien, its title being Nirranda Rural School Number 9. The first teacher was Mrs Eliz. Lee. in July 1870 the school transferred to new premises built by John Lee, the teacher's husband, who was Head Teacher of Mepunga Common School Number 435. In December 1871 it was assigned the title Nirranda Common School Number 1130. A new school opened in 1959.

NOORAT School Number 1178 see page 907/908

Noorat is about 4 miles from Terang. The school, originally a one-room bluestone building was completed 11/11/1875. Margaret Evans (later Mrs James Carson) was Head Teacher and assistants were Mary Denny and Mary Louis Buckholy. A wooden room was added in 1899 - these two rooms were connected by a room approximately 31 x 61, which was aptly named by locals as the Black Hole of Calcutta. An Endowment Plantation was established in 1928 and a Mothers Club formed in 1933. On 191711933 the name of the school was changed from Mt. Noorat to Noorat. there were further additions about 1958. Perhaps one of the best known pupils is Alan Marshall, author of 'I Can Jump Puddles'.

PORT FAIRY (PORT FAIRY CONSOLIDATED) FORMERLY BELFAST School Number 1188
see page 908/909

Port Fairy. formerly Belfast, originated from the Church of England Common School Number 62 which became a State School early 1873. There were 4 other Common Schools - Wesleyan Number 83. Presbyterian Common School Number 68, A National Common School Number 30 (No mention of this school earlier or in Index). A Catholic School Number 95 (Yarriambiac Rural) which closed, but opened

almost immediately as a private school. The Head Master at 1188 was Hugh Young, assistant was Annie Young and Daniel O'Doherty (formerly Head Teacher of the Catholic School). School was conducted in the former premises of the Church of England School. School commenced in a new building 11/11/1874. The school became a Higher Elementary School in 1925 - buildings same as those built in 1874. The H E S closed 1948 and a move was made to consolidate country schools near Port Fairy. Number 1188 was chosen. secondary classes were to be part of the set-up, Cookery and needlework for the girls, Sheetmetal and Woodwork for the boys were major subjects. Schools which closed for consolidation were Orford 1374, Rosebrook 526, Moyne 3677, Yambuck 2458 and Toolong 3595. NOTE: Article on Toolong says it remained open. Quite extensive extensions were made to school.

MAILORS FLAT School Number 1210 see page 909

The description of this school which opened 15/5/1873 is as follows - 'An old wooden building 30' x 8' with a shingle roof, no inside lining and no signs of paint, but in fair order'. The school is on the east side of the Warrnambool to Caramut Road 7.5 miles from the Warrnambool Post office. Julius Castles was the first Head Teacher. The present building was opened 30/11/1874.

BALLANGEICH WEST SEE COORAMOOK School Number 1226 see page 909/910

1226 Cooramook is located 13 miles north of Warrnambool and had an earlier name of Ballangeich west.. First records tell that the school operated half time with Ellerslie. In 1885 the building was transported by bullock dray to the present position at Cooramook. the former site of Ballangeich West is now Cooramook Endowment Plantation. The school closed in May 1930 and reopened February 1943. The official opening of the Memorial Gateway in 1965 honors deceased members of the Committee.

BESSIEBELLE School Number 1238 (2147 BESSIEBELLE) ALSO KNOWN AS BROADWATER
see page 910/911

Head Teacher Grace Square opened SS 1238 on 1/4/1874 in a leased hut on Squattlesea-Mere Property. It closed in 1875. It reappeared as being associated from 1878-79 with SS Homerton, perhaps on a half-time basis but under Homerton's number.

1/7/1879 Head Teacher F K M Bradhurst opened 2147 Broadwater in a leased building. The site for the school was gazetted and in 1880 a portable school arrived. The school retained the name of Broadwater although it was 7 miles from the settlement, and both the Post office and Hall nearby had the name Bessiebelle. It was later changed to Bessiebelle.
